Dr. Caroline Stamu-O'Brien is a diplomate of the American Board of Psychiatry and Neurology. She is a member of the Psychiatry faculty of the NYU School of Medicine and performs clinical duties at Woodhull Medical Center, an affiliate of NYU for seventeen years. She completed her residency at Mount Sinai Medical Center in New York City, after which she completed a fellowship in schizophrenia research and clinical psychopharmacology at the same institution. Her first years on both inpatient and outpatient services at Cornell Weill-NY Presbyterian Hospital were rewarding for her career. Dr. Stamu-O'Brien is the Founder and President of Integrative Psychiatry of NY, PC, a private corporation dedicated to optimizing treatments available in psychiatry and medicine since 2010. Areas of expertise include mood and anxiety disorders, schizophrenia and other psychotic disorders, eating disorders, psychosomatic, sexual and personality disorders. Dr. Stamu-O'Brien completed an Intensive Course in Transcranial Magnetic Stimulation at the Berenson-Allen Center for Noninvasive Brain Stimulation affiliated with Harvard University, Boston in October 2012. Throughout the years she has been active in teaching psychopharmacology lectures to medical students, psychiatry residents, and psychology interns; has presented at Grand Rounds and has co-authored articles in various journals.
